- I. The Command: Stop <u>Deceiving</u> Yourselves: 'Be Not / Do Not Be Deceived'
 - A. The Greek (μή πλανάσθε) English Transliteration *me planasthe;* the Negative Particle (μή) English Transliteration *me* Plus a Verb in the Present Tense and Imperative Mood *Which the Greek Verb* (πλανάσθε) English Transliteration planasthe Translated 'Deceived' Means To <u>Stop</u> Doing Something That You Are Currently Doing = <u>Quit</u> Deceiving Yourselves
 - 1.  - Things Believers Are Either to Do, to Know or Beware of in Order to <u>Protect</u>
 Themselves Against the Deception of Sin
 - a. Know Deception Can Result in <u>Disaster</u> cf 2 Cor. 11:3; 1 Tim. 2:14 cf Gen. 3:1-24
 - b. Maintain <u>Fellowship</u> with a Body of Believers Where There Is a Focus on Growing in the Grace and Knowledge of Jesus, Our Savior and a Genuine, Continual Care and Concern for One Another of Heb. 3:13; Acts 20:32; 2 Pet. 3:18
 - c. Know You Have an <u>Inward</u> Source of Deceit cf Heb. 3:13 Which Is Your <u>Sin Nature</u> cf Rm 7:7-25; Isa. 44:20
 - d. Know That the Power of the Sin Nature Over Us Has Been <u>Broken</u> and We Have Been Set <u>Free</u> from the Dominion of the Sin Nature of Rm. 6:6: The Greek Word Translated: 'Might Be Destroyed' / 'Done Away With' / 'Brought to Nothing'
 - The Word Is an Aorist Tense Form and Should Probably Be Understood as a Culminative Aorist Which Brings Out <u>Two</u> Thoughts:
 - a) The <u>Cessation</u> of the Verbal Action in This Case the Destroying, the Doing Away with or the Bringing to Nothing Has <u>Ended</u>

- b) The <u>Completion</u> of the Verbal Action in This Case the Destroying, the Doing Away, Bringing to Nothing is **Done**
- 2) The Meaning of the Word = To Render <u>Ineffective</u>, to <u>nullify</u>, to be <u>released</u>, from set <u>free</u> from cf Rm. 3:3, 31; 4:14; 7:2, 3, 6; 1 Cor. 1:28; Gal. 3:17
 - e) 'Put off The Old Man' cf Eph. 4:22-24; Col. 3:9-10: The Old Man, The Sin Nature, The Flesh = The Aspect of Our Immaterial Nature Which Seeks to Deceive, Enslave, and Dominate, Control our Hearts, Minds, Souls, Emotions, Volitions So That We Will Function Contrary to The Word of God and Thereby Separate (or Keep Us Separated) from God cf Jn. 8:34; Rm. 6:6, 7, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 17, 18, 19, 20, 22, 23; Rm. 7:5, 8, 14, 15,18, 20, 23, 25; 8:4, 5, 12; Rm. 13:14; 1 Cor. 10:2, 3; Gal. 5:13, 16, 17, 19,24; 6:8; Eph. 2:3; 4:22; Col. 2:18, 23; 2 Pet. 2:18; 1 Jn. 2:16 / We Put Off The Old Man by Knowing, Believing and Applying the Teaching of Rm. 6:6-23
 - i. The Putting Off of the Old Man Begins with Knowing and Believing That Our Old Man Is Crucified of Rm. 6:6: The Word 'Knowing' (γινώσκοντες) English Transliteration ginoskontes Present Tense, Active Voice, Masculine, Nominative Participle Form of the Verb (γινώσκω) English Transliteration Ginosko When the Word Is in This Particular Form It Gives Emphasis to Knowing Something for Sure and with Personal Acknowledgment of What Is Known as Being True of Eph. 5:5; Heb. 10:34; James 1:2-3 2 Pet. 1:20; 3:3
 - ii. That Our Old Man Is <u>Crucified</u> i.e. Put to <u>Death</u>
 Which Does Not Mean the <u>Cessation</u> of the Old
 Man's Being But a <u>Separation</u> from the Old Man's
 Dominion Over You cf Rm. 6:7, 14, 18, 22 (for the
 Scriptural Concept of Death Denoting Separation
 Not Cessation of Being See Gen. 35:18; 1 Ki. 17:1723; 2 Ki. 4:32-37; Lk. 16:22-31 (for physical death
 being the separation of the soul, spirit, heart, mind,
 emotional, volitional apparatus of the inner man
 separating from the physical body) cf Gen. 2:7; Eph.
 2:1-3; Col. 2:13; James 1:15; (for spiritual death
 which is the separation of a person from God)
