 - 2) The Words 'put on, clothe yourself' (ἐνδύω) English Transliteration enduo in Rm. 13:14 Is in the Imperative Mood Thus a Command and Something Believers Are <u>Responsible</u> to Do
 - 3) 'Put on' / 'Clothe Yourself' (ἐνδύω) English Transliteration enduo Should Be Interpreted as an Iterative Aorist Tense and Expresses <u>Repetition</u> of the Putting on / Clothing of Yourself: for Examples of the Iterative Aorist Tense of Mt. 6:11 with Lk. 11:3; Mt. 27:8; Lk. 19:13; Jn. 15:7; 1 Cor. 16:20; Eph. 2:7; 6:11, 17; James 1:2
 - 4) "ἕνδυμα (endyma). N. neut. Garment, clothing. Clothing in general. The verb may be used for literally putting on clothing or figuratively for putting on something conceptual (e.g., clothing oneself with characteristics in Col 3:12. . .)." Lexham Theological Wordbook
