 - 1. To Set One's Love Upon God: The Hebrew Word Translated Love (ເປັນຖ້າ); English Transliteration chasheq Is Not the Usual Hebrew Word for Love (ຊາເຈົ້າ); English Transliteration ahahab Which Is Used 210 Times in the Old Testament and the Word (ເປັນຖ້າ); English Transliteration chasheq Is Used Just 11Times and Denotes a Strong, Intense, Passionate Desire to Be United in a Relationship with Another That Is Rooted in the Attractiveness, Beauty of The Person Who Is the Object of the Love of Gen. 34:8; Ex. 27:17; Ex. 38:17, 28; Deut. 10:15; 21:11; 1 Ki. 9:19; 2 Chr. 8:6

2. 'To Know God's Name': Expresses That the Person Is One Who Has Placed His <u>Trust</u> in God and Is Personally <u>Acquainted</u> with Him, and Knows Who God <u>Is</u>, to the Degree God Has Revealed Himself to be in the Scriptures as to His <u>Nature</u>, Character and the Person Has a Real Experiential <u>Relationship</u> with God cf Gen. 29:5; Ex. 1:8; Ex. 33:12-34:9; Deut. 34:10; 1 Sam. 2:12; 3:7; Job 19:13; Psalm 9:10; 31:11; 36:10; 55:13; 88:8, 18; Isa. 53:3; Jer. 4:22

THEOLOGICAL IMPACT

- God Is Always to Be the <u>First</u> Object of My Love!
- 2. My Love for God Is to Flow from My Heart, Soul, and Mind's Response to the **Beauty** of Who He is, His Nature, Character, Essence.
- 3. For My Love for God to Continue Growing in Passion, and Depth I Must Continue to <u>Grow</u> in My <u>Understanding</u> of Who He is as He has revealed Himself to Be in the Scriptures.
- 4. The More I Want My Love for God to Grow, the More <u>Time</u> I Need to Spend <u>Communing</u> with Him in His Word
- 5. I Need to Praise God Joyfully, Thankfully, Frequently and Fervently for His <u>Infinite Loyal</u>, <u>Everlasting</u>, <u>Beneficent Love</u> for Me; That Never Fluctuates Even When My Love for Him Vacillates and Is Less Than Faithful.
- 6. The <u>Highest</u> Expression of My Love for God and the Most <u>Pleasing</u> Expression of My Love to Him is Responding to His Love for Me, by My <u>Obedience</u> to His Word, His Good and Perfect Will
- 7. I Want to Express My Love for God with All My Heart, and All My Soul, All My Mind Because of the <u>Love</u> Which He <u>First</u> Manifested to Me by <u>Giving</u> His Only Begotten Son to Be the Permanent, Perfect Atoning Sacrifice for My Sins
