- B. David Intently Desired to Promulgate the <u>Fame</u> of the Lord by the Building of the Temple cf 1 Chr. 22:5
 - 1. David Desired to Build a House / Temple *Unto / for the Name* of the Lord of 1 Ki. 5:3, 5; 8:17; 1 Chr. 22:7; 29:16; 2 Chr. 6:7-8
 - 2. The Use of the Words 'for / unto the name of' with the Lord and the Building of the Temple Reveal That the Temple Was Built to Promulgate the <u>Fame</u>, the Awesome <u>Reputation</u> of the Lord
 - 3. Believers Should Earnestly Desire to **Spread** the **Fame** of the Lord Because:
 - a. We Are **Bought** a **Price** of 1 Cor. 6:19-20; 1 Pet. 1:18-19
 - b. It is the **Will** of God for Believers to Glorify Him of 1 Cor. 6:20: 10:31

- I. The Primary Difference Is The **Subject** Who Glorifies God
 - A. The New Revised Standard Version the Subject Who Glorifies God is the <u>Corinthians</u>; The Translation Reads: "Through the testing of this Ministry <u>you</u> glorify God by <u>your</u> obedience to the confession of the gospel of Christ and by the generosity of your sharing with them and with all others." 2 Cor. 9:13
 - B. The New American Standard Bible, The New International Version, The New King James Version and The King James Version; The Subject Who Glorifies God is the <u>Saints</u> at <u>Jerusalem</u> The New American Standard Bible the Translation Reads: "Because of the proof given by this ministry <u>they</u> will glorify God for your obedience to your confession of the gospel of Christ and for the liberality of your contribution to them and to all." 2 Cor. 9:13
