IV. David's Zeal for the Building of the Temple Was to <u>Promulgate</u> the Fame of the Lord and <u>Perpetuate</u> the Practice of Actively, Openly Worshiping God cf 1 Chr. 23:1-26:28

B. David Intently Desired to Spread the <u>Fame</u> of the Lord by Building the Temple cf 1 Chr. 22:5

- 4. To Spread the Fame of the Lord Believers Must Make it the *Priority* of Their Lives cf 1 Cor. 10:31
- 5. <u>How</u> Believers Can Spread the Fame of the Lord
  - a. Follow the <u>Example</u> of Jesus and Live in <u>Obedience</u> to God's Word / Will cf 1 Cor. 11:1; Eph. 5:1-2; 1 Thess. 1:6 with Jn. 5:30; 6:38; 13:31-32 cf 2 Cor. 9:13
  - b. Bear Much Fruit of Jn. 15:8; Philipp. 1:11
    - 1) **Bear** Fruit cf Jn. 15:8
      - a) To Bear Fruit Which Glorifies God One Must Be a <u>Believer</u> in Jesus Christ of Jn. 15:4-5 of Jn. 6:56; 1 Jn. 2:24; 4:15
      - b) To Bear Fruit Which Glorifies God the Believer Must *Continue* to Abide in Christ cf Jn. 15:4-5
      - c) It Is of the Utmost Importance to Have As Clear and Accurate <u>Understanding</u> of the Greek Word Translated 'Abide' or 'Remain', The Word Is (μένω); English Transliteration meno in the Context of Jn. 15:1-8, As We Can; The Word (μένω); English Transliteration meno Is Used Seven Times in These Verses and Is an <u>Important</u> Word
        - i. The Verbal (μένω); English Transliteration meno Is in the <u>Active</u> Voice Every Time It Is Used in Jn. 15:1-8 Revealing That Believers Must <u>Actively</u> Produce the 'Abiding' or 'Remaining' in Jesus to Bear Fruit That Glorifies God

- ii. 'To Abide' or 'Remain' The Greek Word (μένω);
  English Transliteration meno in Christ in This Context Expresses the Thought of Taking up Residence in and Continually Carrying Out the Activity of Living Life Walking by Faith in the Sphere of Christ, Drawing the Life Energizing Sap Which Comes from the Power of the Holy Spirit and Obedience to the Wisdom from His Word, Which Reveals by Commandments, Promises, Precepts and Examples the Way We Are to Live in Order to Glorify the Lord of Mt. 10:11; Mk. 6:10 Lk. 1:56; 8:27; 9:4; 10:7; Jn. 7:9; 10:7; 11:54; 15:9-10; Acts 9:43; 16:15; 18:3; 28:16; 1 Cor. 7:20, 24; 1 Jn. 2:10, 14, 27-28; 3:9, 14-15; 3:17, 24; 4:12, 16; 2 Jn. 2, 9
- iii. Practically Speaking 'to abide in Christ' Requires
  Believers 'to <u>Walk</u> as <u>Christ</u> cf 1 Jn. 2:6: Jesus
  Walked by <u>Faith</u> in God, by the <u>Power</u> of God, in
  <u>Obedience</u> to God cf Mt. 4:3-10; 27:50; Lk. 23:46;
  Jn. 5:30; 7:16; 12:49; 14:10; 15:10
