Their Knowledge Is the Translation of the Greek Word (ἐπίγνωσις) English Transliteration epignosis in the Context the Word Denotes As Complete a Knowledge Gives of Himself and Our Lord Jesus Christ That We in Our Present State Can Apprehend by the Working of God the Holy Spirit, That Is Factual, True, Practical in the Sense We Can Apply It by Faith to Our Relationship with God and Others and to Everyday Life of Rm. 1:28; 3:20; 10:2; Eph. 1:17; Eph. 4:13; Col. 1:9-10; 3:10; 1 Tim. 1:4; 2 Tim. 2:25; 2 Tim. 3:7; Titus 1:1; Heb. 10:26; 2 Pet. 1:3, 8; 3:20

A Prayer for (ἐπίγνωσις = epignosis) Col. 1:9-10

- I. Paul <u>Regularly Requested</u> That the Colossian Believers Would Be Filled with (ἐπιγνωσις) English Transliteration epignosis
 - A. The Regular or <u>Ongoing</u> Nature of the Prayer Is Expressed by the Words: "do not cease to pray" Which Are Present Tense Verbals in the Greek
 - B. Paul's Prayer Was Not An Expression of His Desire But a Direct <u>Request</u> of God, on Behalf of the Colossians; the Word 'Desire' is the Translation of the Greek Word (ἀιτέω); English Transliteration *aiteo* Which Means to <u>Ask</u> of Mt. 7:7, 8, 11; 21:22; Mk. 11:24; Lk. 11:9-10; Jn. 14:13; 15:7, 16; Eph. 3:20; James 1:5-6; 4:2-3; 1 Jn. 3:22; 1 Jn. 5:14-15
 - C. Paul's Prayer Was for the Colossians to Be Filled with 'Knowledge' (ἐπίγνωσις = epignosis) of God's Will Which Happens by Means of the Colossians Attaining Wisdom and Spiritual Understanding of Col. 1:9
 - D. The Words 'All' and 'Spiritual' Apply to Both 'Wisdom' and 'Understanding'
 - E. The Words 'in all wisdom and spiritual understanding' Have **More** Than One Possible Explanation
 - 1. If The Holy Spirit Means for Us to Understand the Words (σοφία); English Transliteration sophia Meaning 'Wisdom' and (σύνεσις); English Transliteration sunesis Translated 'Understanding' As Being in the Locative Case) Then We Are to Apprehend Paul Is Praying for Believers to Be Filled with the Knowledge of God's Will in the **Spheres** of 'Spiritual Wisdom' and 'Spiritual Understanding'
 - 2. If The Holy Spirit Means for Us to Understand the Words (σοφία); English Transliteration sophia Meaning 'Wisdom' and (σύνεσις); English Transliteration sunesis Translated 'Understanding' As Being in the Dative Case) Then We Are to Apprehend That the Knowledge of God's Will That Paul Is Praying for <u>Consists</u> of 'Spiritual Wisdom and Spiritual Understanding'
 - 3. If The Holy Spirit Means for Us to Understand the Words (σοφία); English Transliteration sophia Meaning 'Wisdom' and (σύνεσις); English Transliteration sunesis Translated 'Understanding' As Being in the Instrumental Case) Then We Are to Apprehend Paul Is Praying for Believers to Be Filled with the Knowledge of God's Will by Attaining 'All Wisdom and Spiritual Understanding Which Are Expressing the Means by Which Believers Are Filled with 'Knowledge' (ἐπίγνωσις = epignosis)

- F. 'Spiritual Wisdom' in a Nutshell from God's Perspective: Is The God Given Ability to Apprehend and the Skill to Apply the Word of God <u>Practically</u> to Daily Life of Prv. 2:1-2; 8:1-36; 1 Cor. 2:6-7, 13; Eph. 1:17; James 1:15; 3:13-15, 17
- G. 'Spiritual Understanding' is the Translation of the Greek Word (σύνεσις); English Transliteration sunesis; Acute, Sharp, Keen Spiritual <u>Insight</u> That Is Given to the Believer by The Holy Spirit of 1 Chr. 22:12; Lk. 2:47; Eph. 3:4; 2 Tim. 2:7
- II. <u>Reaso</u>ns Paul Prayed for the Colossians to Be Filled with (ἐπίγνωσις); English Transliteration epignosis of Col. 1:10
 - A. That the Colossian Believers *Life Style / Manner of Life* Be *Worthy* of the Lord
 - 1. The Word 'Worthy' Is the Translation of The Greek Word (ἀξίως); English Transliteration axios; Literally Means: "counterbalancing hence, prop. weighing as much as, of like value" Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament Liddell & Scott / The Word Expresses the Thought of One Thing Being <u>Comparable</u> to, or <u>Corresponding</u> to Another Thing cf Acts 23:29; Rm. 8:18
