Complete a Knowledge That God Gives of Himself and Our Lord Jesus Christ That We Can Apprehend in Our Present State by the Working of God The Holy Spirit, That Is Factual, True and Practical in the Sense We Can Apply It by Faith to Our Relationship with God and Others and to Everyday Life of Rm. 1:28; Rm. 3:20; 10:2; Eph. 1:17; 4:13; Col. 1:9-10; 2:2; Col. 3:10; 1 Tim. 2:4; 2 Tim. 2:25; 3:7; Titus 1:1; Heb. 10:26; 2 Pet. 1:3, 8; 2 Pet. 2:20

### Colossian 1:9 – 10 A Prayer for (ἐπίγνωσις)

"For this cause we also, since the day we heard it, do not cease to pray for you, and to desire that ye might be filled with the knowledge of His will in all wisdom and spiritual understanding; That ye might walk worthy of the Lord unto all pleasing, being fruitful in every good work, and increasing in the knowledge of God;" Col. 1:9-10

- II. The <u>Reason</u> Paul Prayed for the Colossian Believers to Be Filled with 'Knowledge' the Translation of the Greek Word (ἐπίγνωσις) English Transliteration epignosis of God's Will: That Their Lifestyle Will Be <u>Worthy</u> of the Lord
  - A. The Word 'Worthy' Is the Translation of the Greek Word (ἀξίως); English Transliteration Literally Means: "counterbalancing hence, prop. weighing as much as, of like value" Greek-English Lexicon of the New Testament, Liddell & Scott; the Word Expresses the Thought of One Thing Being <u>Comparable</u> to, or <u>Corresponding</u> to Another Thing of Acts 23:29; Rm. 8:18
  - B. The <u>Aim</u> or <u>Goal</u> of a Worthy Walk Is: to <u>Please</u> The Lord in Every Area of Our Life
    - 1. The Word 'Pleasing' Is the Translation of the Greek Word (ἀρεσκεία); English Transliteration areskeia Expresses That Believers Are to Aim for Obsequiousness (i.e. a **Servile Attitude**) That Is Manifest in Seeking to Satisfy and Gratify The Lord in Every Way Possible cf Jn. 8:29
    - 2. The Scriptures Reveal There is a Direct Connection Between the Believer Living in *Obedience* to God's Word by Faith and the Believer *Pleasing* God cf Heb. 11:6; 1 Jn. 3:22
  - C. 'Being Fruitful' Is An Aspect of the Worthy Walk That <u>Requires</u> Believers to Be Filled with the Knowledge (ἐπίγνωσις = epignosis) of God's Will
  - D. 'Increasing' / 'Growing' in the Knowledge (ἐπίγνωσις = epignosis) of God Is An <u>Aspect</u> of the Worthy Walk
