When Human Emotional Enthusiasm Masquerading as Zeal is Brought into the Realm of 'Supposed Service to God' (i.e. religious realm) The Supposed Zealot is Really Promoting His or Her Self and is Not Glorifying God cf Gal. 4:17 with Gal. 6:13; Philipp. 3:4-6 with Gal. 1:14, 21-24; Acts 22:3; 2 Ki. 10:16 with 2 Ki. 10:29-31; Jn. 16:2 with Acts 4:17, 21; 5:17, 33, 49; 8:3; 9:1-2; 14:15, 19; 17:13; 18:12; 19:23-42; 20:27-31; Rm. 2:17, 23; 10:2-4	Will always <u>Glorify</u> / <u>Honor</u> the Lord; The Examples of David of 1 Sam. 17:23-50; Psalm 69:9; 132:1-5; 2 Sam. 7:1-2; 1 Chr. 22:1-5, 6-19; 10:21; Elijah of 1 Ki. 19:10, 14; Meshach, Shadrach, Abednego of Dan 3:1-30; Daniel of Dan. 6:1-28; Stephen of Acts 6:8-7:64

## Differences Between Emotional Human Enthusiasm and Biblical Zeal Demonstrated by the Zeal of David

IV. David's Zeal for the building of the temple was to *promulgate* the fame of the Lord and *perpetuate* the practice of the proper open worship of God cf 1 Chr. 22:5; 23:1-26:28; 28:1-19

(Point A. and all sub points see previous note sheets)

B. David Intently Desire to Promulgate the <u>Fame</u> of the Lord by the Building of the temple cf 1 Chr. 22:5

(Points 1. Through 4. and sub points see previous note sheets)

5. <u>How</u> Believers, who are the only temple of God in the world today can spread the fame of the Lord (i.e. glorify him in the world today) cf 1 Cor. 6:19-20

(Point a. and all sub points see previous note sheets)

b. **Bear** much fruit cf Jn. 15:1-8; Philipp. 1:9-11; Col. 1:9-10

(Point 1) and all sub points see previous note sheets)

- 2) Paul's prayer for the Philippian believers reveals that *fruit in the believer's life* **Glorifies** God cf Philipp. 1:9-11
  - a) The <u>Content</u> of the Prayer cf Philipp. 1:9
  - b) <u>Purposes</u> of the prayer cf Philipp. 1:10
    - ii. Believers might be 'sincere' is the translation of the Greek word (εἰλικρινής); English transliteration eilikrines the word means <u>Unmixed</u> in this context the word denotes without <u>Mixed Motives</u>
    - iii. 'without offense' / 'blameless' is the translation of the Greek word (ἀπροσκοπος); English Transliteration aproskopos; without offense or blameless in the sense of not stumbling into <u>Sin</u> or causing others to <u>Sin</u> of Acts 24:16; 1 Cor. 10:32; compare the verb (πρόσκομαι); English transliteration proskomai, without the negating alpha privative (α = a) of Rm. 9:32-33; 14:13, 20
