 <u>Sheep</u> and They Did So for the Purpose of <u>Deceiving</u> the People of God
 cf 1 Sam. 15:27; 28:14;1 Ki. 19:13,19; 2 Ki. 2:8, 13-14 cf Zech. 13:4

- False Prophets in the Old Testament Sought to <u>Deceive</u> the People of God and Cause Them to <u>Believe</u> Something <u>Untrue</u> cf Jer. 14:13-15
