The Word of God Is the Water and Food Source of Spiritual Health

'He Shall be Like' The Psalmist Uses a <u>SIMILE</u> a Figure of Speech Involving the <u>COMPARISON</u> of One Thing with Another Thing of a Different Kind

The Psalmist Used a Simile to Make His Statement, More emphatic and Vivid to Illustrate What the <u>Results</u> Getting One's Guidance for Life from the Word of God as Opposed to the Counsel, Thoughts, Ways of Mankind Living Apart from God and His Word and

Four Things to **Ponder** in Psalm 1:3

- 1. The Tree Is <u>Planted</u> Is the Translation of the Hebrew Word אָם English Transliteration shathel = Literally means <u>TRANSPLANTED</u> and is in the <u>PARTICIPLE FORM</u> denoting a <u>PERMANENT</u>, FIXED STATE
- 2. The Tree is Planted **Close** to the **Source** of the Water
- 3. The Tree is *Healthy*: bringeth forth its *fruit* in its season; its leaf also *shall not* wither. ."
- 4. The Person Who Does These Things Will <u>Prosper</u> The Simile in This Context Is Likening a Person to a Healthy Fruit Bearing Tree Thus the Context Demands That the Prosperity of the Person Be Viewed in Terms of the Person Bringing Forth <u>Fruit</u> in its Season.

Summing Up the Theology and Its Impact

- 1. Elders Who Are Responsible for the Spiritual Health of the Sheep the Lord Has Placed Them in the Midst of to Shepherd, *Must Teach the Word*, So That Believers May Drink of and Eat from the God's Refrigerator and Pantry of the *Life Sustaining, Spiritual Health Maintaining Word of God* and Help Them Say Close to Jesus
- 2. Believers Must Remain in *Constant*, *Continual Contact* with and *Drink* the Life Giving, Life Sustaining, Spiritual Health Maintaining Water of the Word of God and *Eat* the Life Sustaining, Spiritual Health Maintaining Food of the Word of God
- 3. Elders and Believers **Must Stay Close** to the Lord Jesus Christ and His Word.
