Observations from Prv. 8:18

"Riches and honor (are) with me (wisdom); yea, durable riches and righteousness. My fruit (is) better than gold, yea, than fine gold; and my revenue than choice silver. I lead in the way of righteousness, in the midst of the paths of justice, That I may cause those who love me to inherit substance; and I will fill their treasuries." Prv. 8:18-20

- <u>Me</u> refers to <u>Wisdom</u> Which Has Been Personified, That Is treated as Being a Person, a Woman, We Might Say <u>Lady</u> Wisdom cf Prv. 8:1, 11, 12
