- The Word *heresies* Is the Transliteration of the Greek Word (αἵρεσις) a. English Transliteration hairesis Literally Denotes a Group of People or Sect Who Holds to Specific Tenets of Acts 5:17; 15:5; 24:5; 28:2 / in This Context the Word Denotes False Doctrine; Teaching Which is Contrary to That Which Had Been Revealed to the Apostles and by the Holy Spirit, Based upon the Gospel of Jesus Christ, Delivered to Believers by Means of the Writings of the Apostles to the Churches cf Jn. 16:13; Acts 6:7; 14:22; 16:5; Gal. 1:11-17; 2:8; 1 Cor. 1:10; 2:2, 4-5, 7, 1 Cor. 2:13; 16:13; 2 Cor. 11:2 cf 11:23; 13:5; Eph 2:20; 3:1-5; Philipp. 1:27: Col 1:23, 25-29; 1 Tim. 1:3, 19; 2 Tim. 1:13; 2:2, 18; Titus 1:9, 13-14 Titus 2:2; 3:10; Heb 5:1; 6:1; 2 Pet. 3:16; Jude 3
