  - revel / carouse (τρυφή) English Transliteration truphe Is Only Used in 2 Pet. 2:13 and Lk. 7:25 the Cognate Verb (τρυφάω) English Transliteration truphao of James 5:5 Denotes Self-Indulgence
  - 2) 'in the daytime' / broad daylight': The Pointing to the Self-Indulgence Being Carried Out in the Daytime Marks the Self-Indulgence as Being <u>Grossly Excessive</u> cf Eccl. 10:16; Isa 5:11
