 - b) The Word 'Ravenous / Ferocious' (ἄρπαξ) English Transliteration harpax, Literally Means Robber, <u>Swindler</u>, Extortioner cf Lk. 18:11; 1 Cor. 5:10, 11; 6:10; the Use of This Word Exposes False Teachers as Being Religious <u>Hucksters</u> Who Preach for Personal *Monetary Gain* cf 2 Cor. 2:17; 4:2; 2 Pet. 2:3, 15; Jude 11

- i. The Use of the Word (ἄρπαξ) English Transliteration harpax to Describe the Wolf Which Is a Metaphor for False Teachers Reveals the Danger the False Teacher Poses for Believers: They Can <u>Destroy</u> the Faith of Believers and <u>Ruin</u> Their Spiritual Lives cf 2 Tim. 2:17-18; Titus 1:10-11
- ii. The Use of the Word ἃρπαξ English Transliteration harpax Exposes One of the Primary <u>Motives</u> of False Teachers: <u>Greed</u>, Desire for Personal Monetary Gain cf 2 Cor. 2:17^a
